DESCRIPTION OF FLOWER

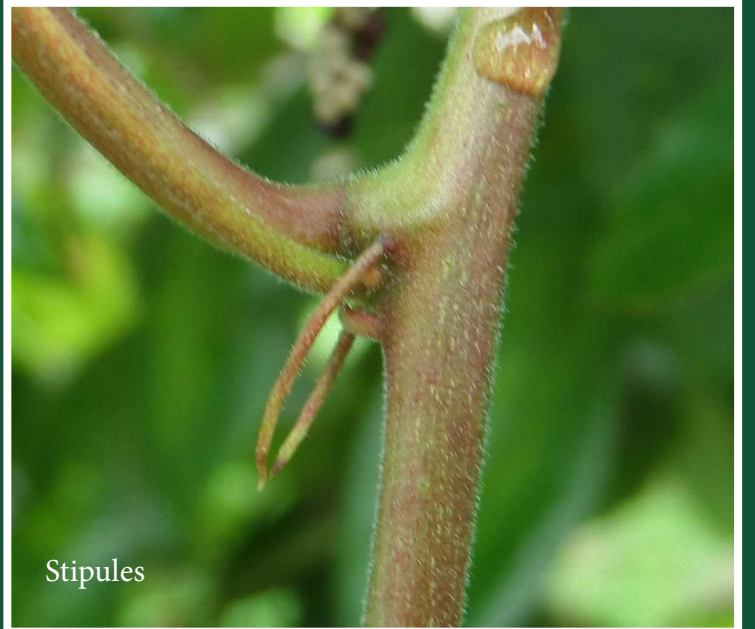
Flower diameter	7.0cm
Peduncle/stalk length	3.0cm
Colour of petals and sepals	both white spotted with pale mauve
Coronal series	2 series. Outer about 3 cm, erect, surrounding the androgynophore, mauve, white at base. Inner short (about 3mm), white
Scent description	Very pronounced, hyacinth-like
Flowering details	First flowered at 24 months. Solitary. Flowers throughout the year, except April and May (the hottest season)
Bracts	About 1.5cm, 4 glands

DESCRIPTION OF LEAVES ETC

Leaf length	8.0cm
Leaf width	7.0cm
Petiole/stalk length	3.0cm
Leaf lobes: number	3
Leaf shape	Broad
Leaf details	Variable, width sometimes greater than length. Glabrous, becoming coriaceous over time
Petiole glands	2 at the base of the petiole
Stipules	Small, linear
Vine	Young shoots are reddish, as are petioles and leaf veins. Vigorous, sends up suckers some way from plant. Virus-prone
